How it works:

1

Print

This package includes pages with cut lines to ensure your printer doesn't cut off the edges and to help you line up the poster when you put it together. If you have more than 16 students, simply cut the pages in half or have students work in pairs. The finished poster is about 16 feet long. To create a smaller poster, print two pages per sheet.

2

Colour

There are so many ways this project can be completed and the end result will be so unique for every class. Use crayon, marker, paint, pastel, anything! Give students parameters for the type of designs or patterns they can put on the shirt or just let their creativity reign free. Just be sure that they are mostly using shades of orange.

3

Assemble

When students are done colouring, have them cut out their image. Some pages will be cut along the cut lines and others will be cut along the edge of the image. Lay out all the pieces to ensure they are lined up and in the correct location. You can carefully flip the pages over and tape them together at the seams, glue them to a piece of poster paper, or staple them to a bulletin board.

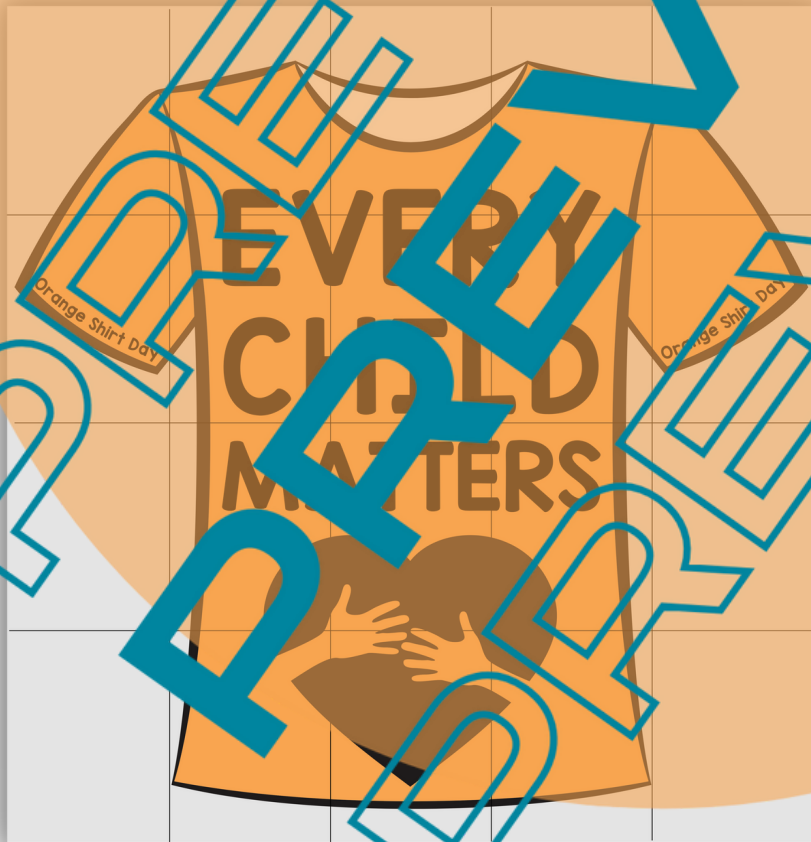

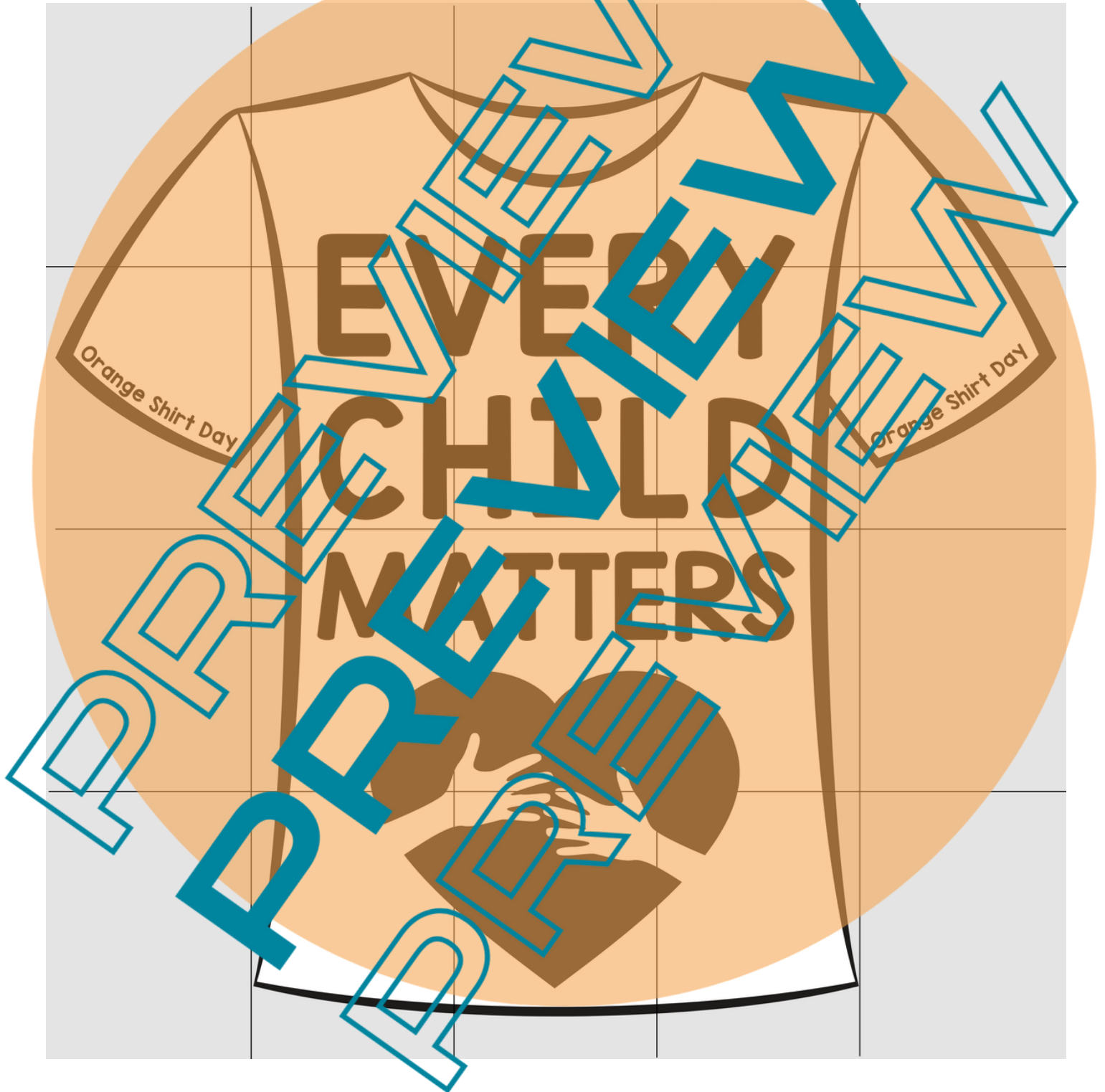


ENTER TO WIN

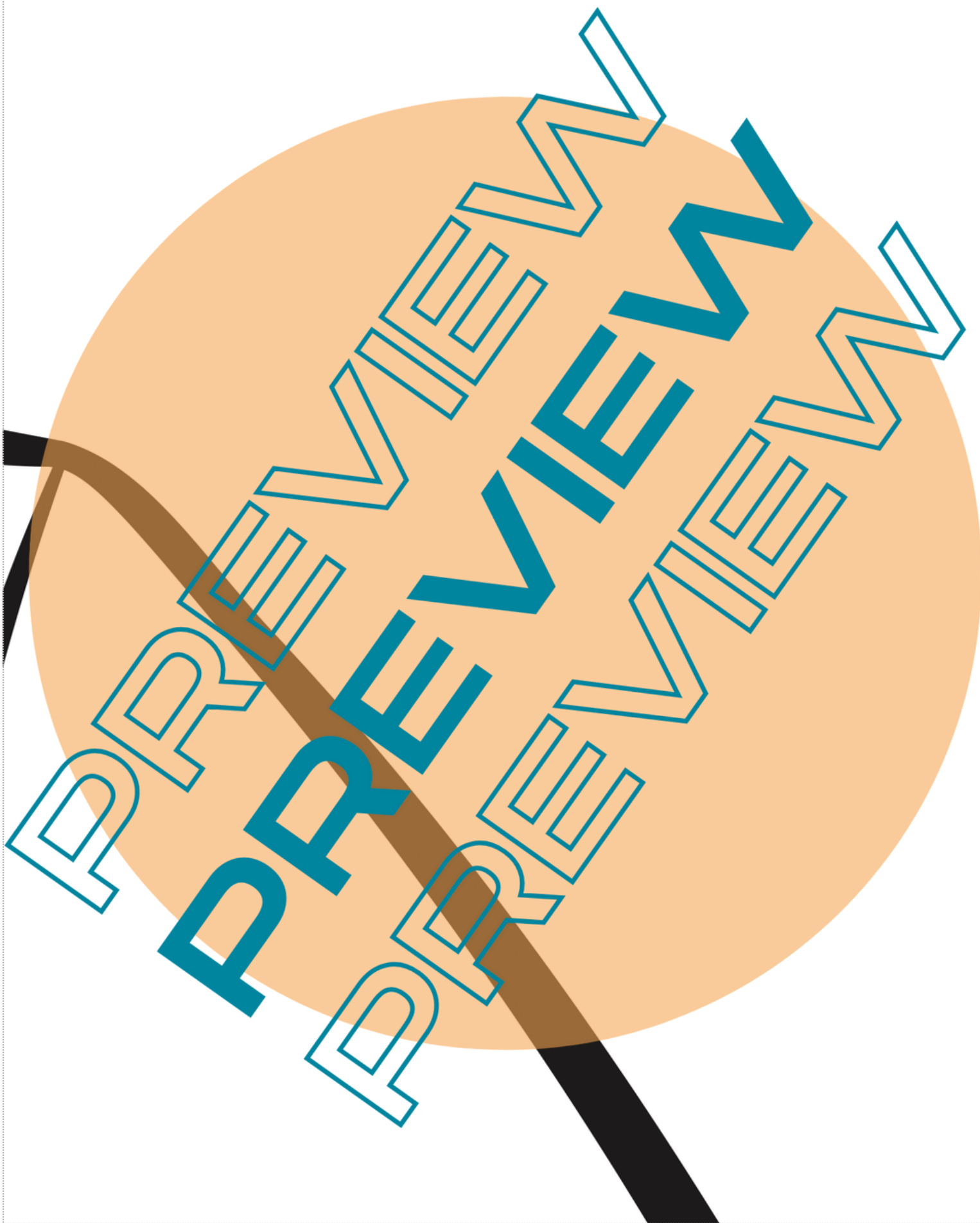

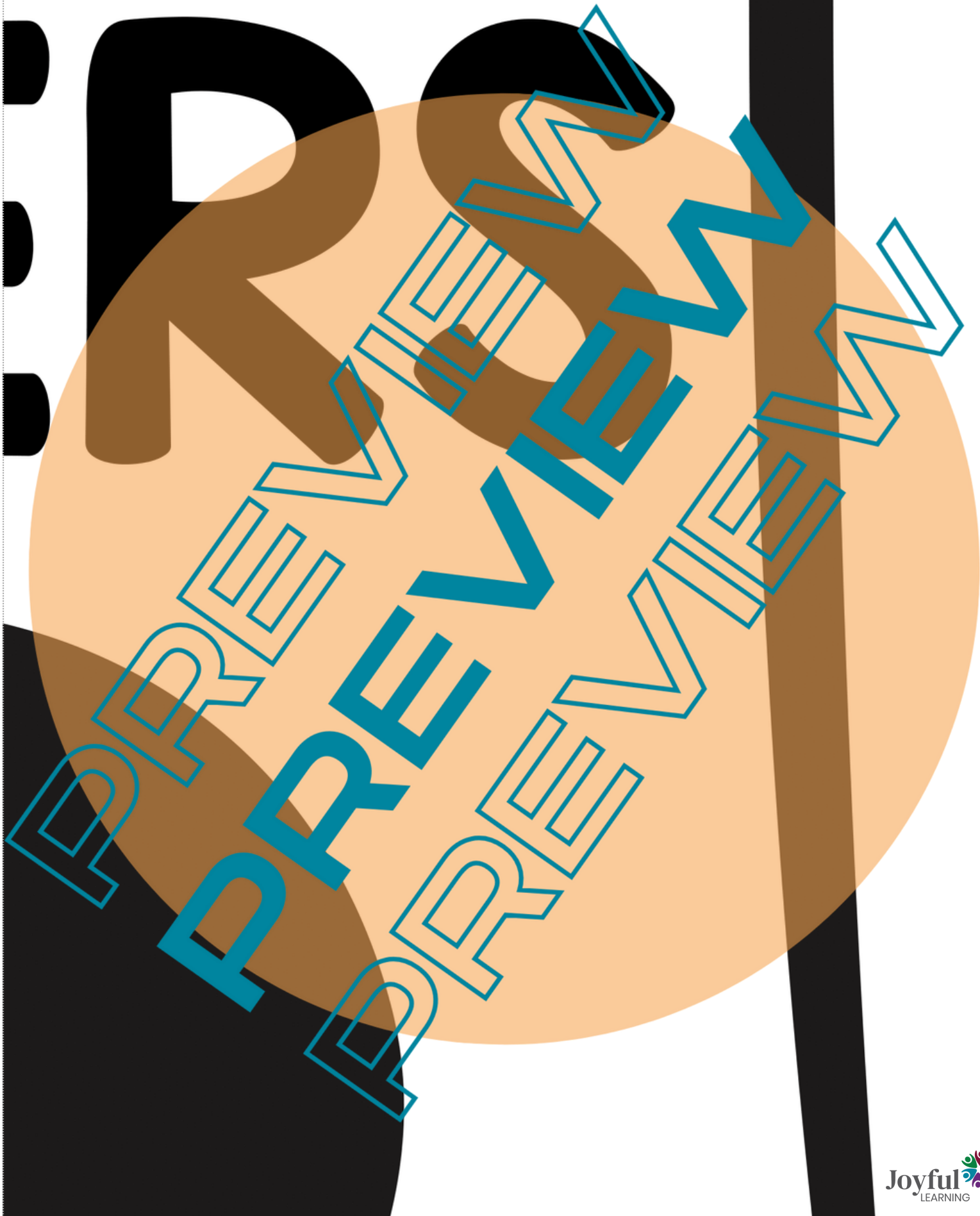

She is Interior Salish and Metis and grew up in British Columbia's Nicola Valley. Many members of her family, including her grandfather and mother attended residential schools.
